History of Robert Chamberlin Award:

This award was created in 2004 by FSNH on honor of Dr. Robert Chamberlin. Dr. Chamberlin is a public health pediatrician with a long history of advocacy for children, families, and the importance of prevention programming. He is known as the father of Family Resource Centers, having initiated the statewide movement in New Hampshire in the 1990's. He was instrumental in helping individual agencies get started like The Children's Place and Parent Education Center and The Whole Village Family Resource Center. Dr. Chamberlin keeps in touch with Family Support New Hampshire today, and we are proud to call him an emeritus member.

Criteria For Selection:

The nominee must:

- 1. Have made a state-wide impact on children and families through advocacy, direct care, policy or funding, and*
- 2. Have at least ten years of service to children and families in NH.*
