Family Resource Centers help families and their members find solutions to unique challenges, strengthening connections to one another and the community, empowering each family to be successful and resilient.

What does a Family Resource Center do?
FRCs provide family supports, parenting programs and groups, home visiting, child development screening, and information and referral to community resources that help families thrive.

Programs offered are strengths-based, embracing each individual's and family's existing strengths in search of practical solutions.

Working with both children and caregivers in a two-generational approach gives the entire household the tools it needs to be the most effective and successful family it can be.
